RMR SUPPLEMENT TO CAP REGULATION 66-1

Operations

CAP AIRCRAFT MAINTENANCE MANAGEMENT

SUMMARY OF CHANGES:

Note: This supplement supersedes all other previous RMR CAPR 66-1 supplements.

CAPR 66-1, dated 14-SEP-2015 is supplemented as follows:

4 Responsibilities. (Added)

4.1 All maintenance on aircraft assigned to Region Headquarters, which is not sub-assigned to a wing, will be under the direct control of the RMR/DO or his assistant (ADO). This includes grounding and all scheduled and un-scheduled maintenance to comply with this regulation.

4.2 All maintenance on RMR assigned aircraft will be completed by the current NHQ/LGM Consolidated Maintenance Procedures and Policies.

7.4. Pilot/Aircrew Reported Discrepancies. (Added)

7.4.1 All discrepancies will be reported directly to the RMR/DO or ADO by the pilot or other aircrew member or FRO releasing the aircraft.

7.4.2 RMR/DO will enter the discrepancies into WMIRS and arrange for the discrepancies to be checked, repaired as needed, and signed off in the appropriate log books.

7.4.3 If it is determined that the aircraft has to be grounded it will be noted in the online discrepancy and the "Grounded – DO NOT FLY" card in the AIF will be placed on the pilot seat of the aircraft.

7.4.4 RMR/DO will close out the discrepancy in WMIRS and state what the current status of the aircraft is, as stated in WMIRS.

9.5 Survival Kits (Added)

9.5.1 Survival Kits. RMR Standardized Survival Kits are required to be equipped and carried in all RMR powered airplanes for all flights.

9.5.2 All items on the RMR list are required items and cannot be deleted or left out. Wings have the option to add additional items to the list.

9.5.3 Survival kit checklist is required to be filled out initially and inserted in each kit. A quarterly inspection and a new checklist will be filled out and put in the kit. If any expired items are replaced outside of the quarterly inspection, an updated checklist will be filled out and placed in the kit. An additional copy of the survival kit checklist shall be put in the aircraft AIF, under Tab #2.

<input type="checkbox"/>	Survival Sleeping bags, 1 per seat, either Plastic or insulating type
<input type="checkbox"/>	Survival cord - rope or Parachute Cord. 50 ft

<input type="checkbox"/>	Watch or stocking Caps, 1 per seat (suggested color is Orange)
